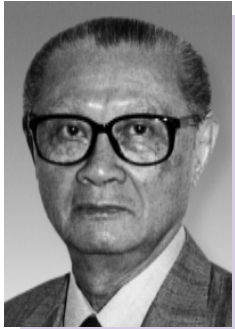

Tan Sri G B Ong



Professor Tan Sri G B Ong is Emeritus Professor at The University of Hong Kong. He graduated from the Medical School of The University of Hong Kong in 1947. He was appointed to the Chair of Surgery at The University of Hong Kong in 1964 until his retirement in 1982.

Professor Ong is recognised internationally for his contributions to surgery, particularly in the fields of esophageal cancer surgery, hepatobiliary surgery and surgical oncology. As a recipient of the Hunterian Professorship, Moynihan Lectureship and the Sims Travelling Professorship to the Commonwealth, he has travelled widely and delivered numerous eponymous lectures internationally.

He has published over 250 papers on various aspects of general surgery, as well as having contributed to books and monographs.

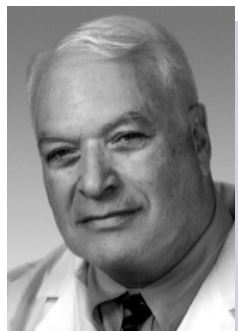
Professor S K Lam



Professor Lam was medically qualified at the University of Hong Kong in 1967, and received specialist training in gastroenterology in Edinburgh. He has over 300 papers in international journals, thirty-five book chapters and nine books. He is the founding Editor of the Journal of Gastroenterology and Hepatology, and has served on the editorial board of more than twenty international journals of gastroenterology and medicine. His current research interests are in *Helicobacter pylori* infection, gastric cancer, NSAID gastropathy, non-ulcer dyspepsia, and motility disorders of the gut. He is now the President of the Asia Pacific Association of Gastroenterology, and Research Chairman of OMGE or the World Association of Gastroenterology.

For his achievements in medicine and gastroenterology, he was awarded the Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire in 1997. In 2002, he delivered the Bockus Lecture and received the Bockus Medal awarded every four years at the World Congress of Gastroenterology to a scientist in gastroenterology in recognition of the contributions of the highest order that his or her work has to the world.

Professor J L Grosfeld



Professor Grosfeld graduated from the New York University (NYU) School of Medicine in 1961, where he stayed on to complete his residency. After 2 years of military service, Professor Grosfeld began his training in paediatric surgery at the Columbus Children Hospital at the Ohio State University. In 1970, he returned to NYU as an Assistant Professor. Two years later, in 1972, he was appointed the first Professor and Director of Paediatric Surgery at the Indiana University. In 1985, Professor Grosfeld became the Chairman of the Department of Surgery at Indiana University. Currently, he is the Program Training Director in both General Surgery and Paediatric Surgery at the Indiana University.

Professor Grosfeld has been honoured throughout his surgical career. He is best known for his expertise in neonatal surgery, paediatric surgical oncology and surgical education. Professor Grosfeld has lectured extensively, both nationally and internationally. He is a member of numerous academic and professional societies and has been elected as an honorary member of eight overseas surgical societies. He was also awarded the Denis Browne gold medal from the British Association of Paediatric Surgeons in 1998. Professor Grosfeld is currently the Chairman of the Board of the American Paediatric Surgical Association Foundation, Secretary-Treasurer of the International Surgical Society Foundation, and the Vice-Chairman of the ACGME-Residency Review Committee for Surgery. He is also the present Editor-in-Chief of the *Journal of Paediatric Surgery* and *Seminars in Paediatric Surgery* as well as being an editorial board member of various prestigious journals. Professor Grosfeld has contributed extensively to the surgery literature, having published more than 440 scientific articles, 104 book chapters and 6 textbooks.

Professor J Jeekel



Professor Jeekel started his surgical training at St. Elisabeth Hospital, Leiden, The Netherlands in 1966 after obtaining his medical degree at the Leiden University, The Netherlands. He later went on to spend two years as a Clinical and Research Fellow at the Surgical Department of the Massachusetts General Hospital, Harvard University, Boston. Professor Jeekel then completed his residency at University Hospital Dijkzigt, Rotterdam, and in 1974, joined its Department of Surgery. In 1976, he became the Professor of Surgery, Medical Faculty Maastricht, The Netherlands. Professor Jeekel was first appointed Professor of Surgery, Medical Faculty Erasmus University, University Hospital Dijkzigt, Rotterdam in 1980 and then as the Head of Department of Surgery, University Hospital Rotterdam in 1987.

Professor Jeekel is active in clinical and basic research in various fields of general surgery including hernia repair and adhesive obstruction. He has been a committee member of numerous national and international societies. Professor Jeekel has been the President of both the European Surgical Association and the National Society of Surgery. At present, he holds editorial positions in a number of international journals including *Annals of Surgery* and *Langenbeck's Archives of Surgery*. Professor Jeekel has published extensively in peer-reviewed journals in various fields of surgery.

Professor J N Myers



Professor Myers obtained his PhD in Biochemistry as well as MD from the Pennsylvania School of Medicine in 1991. He completed his internship in General Surgery as well as his residency in Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine. After the completion of his residency, Professor Myers undertook a one-year Fellowship in Head and Neck

Surgery at the M.D. Anderson Cancer Centre, Houston, Texas, where he became a faculty member in Head and Neck Surgery in 1997. Professor Myers is currently an Associate Professor of Surgery as well as the Fellowship Program Director at the Department of Head and Neck Surgery, University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Centre.

Professor Myers began his research in the immunobiology of head and neck cancer during his residency. He developed subspecialty interests in the areas of laryngeal pre-malignancy, head and neck melanoma and oral tongue cancer. Professor Myers is currently the co-investigator of the study, Biochemopreventive Therapy of Laryngeal Premalignancy, which is funded by the National Cancer Institute. Besides being a member of many professional societies, Professor Myers also participates actively in the American College of Surgeons Oncology Group, the Radiation Therapy Oncology Group and the National Cancer Institute's Head and Neck Intergroup, as well as serves as an editorial board member of the *American Journal of Otolaryngology* and *Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery*. He has published extensively in peer-reviewed journals on the areas of head and neck malignancies.

Professor J H Peters



After graduation from the Ohio State University at Columbus in 1981, Professor Peters continued his internship, fellowship in immunology, and residency at the Johns Hopkins Hospital, Baltimore. In 1991, he joined the University of Southern California as an Assistant Professor in Surgery, before being promoted to Associate Professor in 1997 and then again in 2000 to Professor in

Surgery. Professor Peters is currently the Program Director in Surgery at the University of Southern California.

Professor Peters' research interests include the physiology and pathophysiology of esophageal and foregut disease, esophageal adenocarcinoma as well as laparoscopic and minimally invasive surgery. He is extremely active in both clinical and laboratory research and has been awarded numerous research grants. In addition to acting as a consultant to a number of advisory boards in industry, Professor Peters has served as a committee member of various professional societies. He was also the President of the Society of American Gastrointestinal Endoscopic Surgeons in 1999 - 2000. Besides being an ad hoc reviewer of various prestigious surgical journals, Professor Peters is an editorial board member of the *Diseases of the Esophagus*, *Hernia* and *Video Journal General Surgery*. He has published over 120 articles in peer-review journals, as well as two books and more than 60 book chapters.

Professor H J Stein



Professor Stein graduated from the Technical University of Munich in 1986. He spent his internship at the Creighton University School of Medicine, Omaha, Nebraska before continuing his residency in the Department of Surgery, University of Southern California, Los Angeles, and then at the Technical University of Munich, Germany. In 1998, Professor Stein obtained his PhD from the Technical

University of Munich, where he is currently an Associate Professor as well as Consultant General and Thoracic Surgeon.

Professor Stein is renowned for his expertise in esophageal and foregut surgery. He is a member of many national and international professional societies. In addition to being the editor or co-editor of four textbooks, Professor Stein is the present Managing Editor of the *Diseases of the Esophagus*. He is also a member of the Research Committee on Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease of the International Society for Diseases of the Esophagus as well as a member of the Permanent Scientific Committee of the International Organisation for Statistical Studies on Disease of the Esophagus. Professor Stein has given over 50 invited lectures and presentations worldwide, and made over 200 scientific presentations at national and international meetings. He has written or is the co-author of over 300 scientific articles and book chapters.
