Kenelm Hutchison Digby



Professor Kenelm Hutchison Digby, OBE, MBBS (Lond), FRCS (Eng), was born on 4 August 1884. He was the first holder of the Chair of Anatomy of the Faculty of Medicine, The University of Hong Kong from 1913 to 1923. At almost the same time he was also the Ho Tung Professor of Clinical Surgery from 1915 to 1945, and then appointed Professor of Surgery of the University from 1923 to 1945. He was finally conferred the title of Emeritus Professor of Surgery from

1950, a title which he held until his death on 23 February 1954.

During his tenure in the University, Professor Digby was a dedicated teacher, a fine surgeon, and was a great gentleman to all who knew him

It was to encourage the study and advancement of surgery and to pay tribute to this great man that a fund was raised and donated to The University of Hong Kong by past medical graduates in Hong Kong, Malaysia and Singapore to perpetuate the memory of Professor Digby in the form of a Gold Medal, the Digby Memorial Gold Medal, awarded to students who are in their final MB examination scored at their first attempt the highest marks in Surgery; and to invite a speaker of eminence to deliver the Digby Memorial Lecture.

Digby Memorial Lecturer

Dr. Alice Lam



Dr. Alice Lam received her Bachelor of Arts Degree from The University of Hong Kong in 1963. She went on to pursue studies in Law and became a practicing solicitor in 1978. In her distinguished career she has worked as the Director of the Hong Kong Telephone Co. Ltd., Managing Director and Deputy Chief Executive of the Hang Seng Bank Co. Ltd., and as Co-Chairman of Sotheby's Asia.

Dr. Lam has been active in public service; she was Chairman of the Hong Kong Family

Association from 1980 to 1983. She has also served in various government boards including the Securities Commission, and the Town Planning Appeal Board.

In the past 20 years, Dr Lam has made dedicated and significant contributions to the development of secondary and higher education in Hong Kong. She was Governor of the Chinese International School Foundation, Member of the Lord Wilson United College Scholarship Fund, Governor of the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, Honorary Treasurer of the Chinese University of Hong Kong, and Vice-Chairman of the same University. She is also trustee of the Ma Chung Ho Kei Foundation, the Croucher Foundation, and the Stephen Cheong Foundation.

In 1998, she was appointed member of the University Grants Committee, and assumed Chairmanship of the Committee in 1999. Under her insightful leadership, the Committee conducted a comprehensive review of the Hong Kong higher education system and put forward a series of visionary and constructive recommendations on the further development of education in Hong Kong.

In recognition of Dr. Lam's contributions to the community, she was awarded Gold Bauhinia Star by the HKSAR Government in 2003.

Professor Karl Hörmann



Professor Hörmann had his undergraduate education in medical schools at the University of Munich, Vienna and Kiel. He had his residency training at the Department of Otorhinolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery, University Hospital Hamburg-Eppendorf, and became Consultant of the Department in 1982. He had his fellowship in Plastic Surgery and was qualified as University Lecturer at the University of Hamburg in 1985. In 1987, he became the

Chairman In-Charge of the Department of Otorhinolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery, University Hospital Lübeck. From 1989 to 1992, he was the Chairman of the Department of Otorhinolarygnology, Head and Neck Surgery, Klinikum der Universitätstadt Kaiserlautern. Since 1993, he has been the Head and Chairman of Department of Otorhinolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery, University Hospital Mannheim.

Professor Hörmann is both an ENT and plastic surgeon. His main interests are genetic and immunological aspects of head and neck cancer and sleep medicine. He is a member of various medical and scientific societies, including as Head of the clinical section "Endoscopy" of the German ENT Society, Vice Head of the clinical section "Sleep medicine" of the German ENT Society. He is also the Vice Dean of the Faculty of Clinical Medicine Mannheim of the University of Heidelberg.

Professor Fabrizio Michelassi



Professor Michelassi graduated from The University of Pisa, School of Medicine, Italy in 1975. In 1981-1983, he was a Research Fellow in Surgery, Department of Surgery, Massachusetts General Hospital, Harvard University. After completed his residency at New York University in 1984, he became Attending Surgeon and Assistant Professor of Surgery at the University of Chicago Medical Centre, Illinois. In 1990, he became Consulting Surgeon at Louis A Weiss

Memorial Hospital in Chicago and Associate Professor of Surgery in University of Chicago. Since 1995, he has been Professor of Surgery and Chairman of Surgery Care Centre, University of Chicago. Currently, he is The Stinson Professor, Surgeon-in-Chief and Chairman of Department of Surgery, New York Presbyterian Hospital, Weill Medical College of Cornell University.

Professor Michelassi's interest is in surgical oncology and inflammatory bowel disease. He has published more than 70 papers in refereed journals, 24 book chapters and 1 book. He is also member of various societies and task forces. He is the Associate Editor of Hepatogastroenterology and member of the Scientific Committee of Research in Surgery.

Professor Peter J Neuhaus



Professor Neuhaus had his undergraduate education at the University of Münster, University of Freiburg and Royal Infirmary, Glasgow. After surgical board qualification in 1979, he was the Staff Surgeon at the Clinic of Visceral- and Transplantation Surgery, Hannover, where he became Senior Surgeon in 1981. He obtained his university lecturing qualification as Teaching Professor of Surgery in 1982. From 1985 to 1988, he was the Director of General Surgery,

Municipal Hospital Braunschweig. In 1988, he became the Director, Clinic for General, Visceral and Transplantation Surgery, Charité, Campus Virchow Clinic, Humboldt-University Berlin. He is also Full Professor of Surgery, Free University Berlin, FRG.

Professor Neuhaus' main interests are liver transplantation, liver preservation, transplantation immunology, bioartifical liver and oncological surgery of the liver and biliary tree. He is also member of many distinguished medical and scientific societies. From 1993 to 1997, he was the president of German Transplantation Society and in 2001-2002 he was the president of International Liver Transplantation Society. Professor Neuhaus received the "Von Langenbeck Preis" of the German Surgical Society for research on extracorporeal liver perfusion in 1983. He was also granted the Karel Pavlik Award by the Czech Surgical Society for development and establishment of liver transplantation in the Czech Republic and the Czech-German cooperation on the field of transplantation.

Professor Marco G Patti



Professor Patti graduated at the Universita' di Catania in 1981. After his residency training in Ospedale Vittorio Emanuele II, Catania, Italy, he had his Postdoctoral Research Fellowship in Gastrointestinal Surgery at the University of California, San Francisco. He became Resident in General Surgery in Department of Surgery, UCSF and from 1989 to 1991, he was Research Fellow in Gastrointestinal Surgery in UCSF. He was also Honorary Clinical Associate in the

Department of Surgery, University of Hong Kong in 1993. He was appointed Assistant Professor in Residence in Department of Surgery, UCSF in 1994 and became Associate Professor since 2000. He has been the Director of Center for Study of Gastrointestinal Motility and Secretion, UCSF since 1994. He also became Director of UCSF Bariatric Surgery Centre in 2000.

Professor Patti's main interests are gastrointestinal motility disorders, bariatric surgery and esophageal surgery. He has undertaken extensive teaching and visiting professorship in Europe and United States. Besides members of various societies and committees, he is also Treasurer of the International Society for Digestive Surgery and member of the editorial board of *Journal of Laparoendoscopic & Advanced Surgical Techniques*. He has published more than 70 refereed papers and 24 book chapters.
