Professor Tan Sri G B Ong

(1922 - 2004)



Professor Ong, affectionately known as "GB", graduated from the Medical School of The University of Hong Kong in 1947. He was appointed to the Chair of Surgery at The University of Hong Kong in 1964. He became an Emeritus Professor at the University of Hong Kong following his retirement in 1982 - a position which was bestowed on him till his passing away on 10 January 2004 after a courageous battle with cancer.

Professor Ong was recognised internationally for his contributions to surgery, particularly in the fields of esophageal cancer surgery, hepatobiliary surgery and surgical oncology. Throughout his career, Professor Ong was showered with richly merited honours and distinctions. His skills were recognised by a battery of authorities and agencies which clamoured for his expertise. As a recipient of the Hunterian Professorship, Moynihan Lectureship and the Sims Travelling Professorship to the Commonwealth, he travelled widely and delivered numerous eponymous lectures internationally.

He published over 250 papers on various aspects of general surgery, as well as having contributed to books and monographs. He was made member of nearly 30 medical societies. For his service to the community and professional achievements, he was made O.B.E. by Her Majesty the Queen; and 'Tan Sri' by His Majesty the King of Malaysia.

Numerous obituaries published in his honour in both medical and non-medical media are testimony to his prominent place in global surgical fraternity. His legendary stamina and determination as a master surgeon, teacher and a visionary will always be remembered.

G B Ong Visiting Professor

Professor Kathryn D Anderson



Professor Anderson obtained her BA and MA with honours at Cambridge University, England, then after graduating from the Harvard Medical School, finished her surgical residency at the Department of Surgery of Georgetown University Hospital, Washington, D.C. This was followed by a fellowship in paediatric surgery at the Children's National Medical Center in Washington, D.C. In 1974 she joined the George Washington University and held positions of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, and then Professor of Surgery and Paediatrics until 1992. Professor

Anderson then moved to southern California to assume the position of Surgeon-in-Chief of the Children's Hospital Los Angeles from 1992 to 2004. During this time, she also served as Professor of Surgery and Vice-Chair of the Department of Surgery at the University of Southern California. Since 2004, Professor Anderson has been Professor Emeritus of Surgery, Keck School of Medicine, University of Southern California.

Professor Anderson has been an active participant in and leader of numerous activities of the American College of Surgeons. She has served as a member of the Board of Governors (1986-1992), an ex-officio member of the Board of Regents (1992-2002), First Vice-President (2001-2002), and President-Elect (2004-2005) of the College. She was appointed as the 86th President of the College in 2005. Professor Anderson is also a member of many surgical organisations and has held leadership positions in many professional societies. She was the President of the American Paediatric Surgical Association (1999-2000) and is currently the Second Vice President of the American Surgical Association.

Professor Anderson has devoted her career to surgical research and has showed a strong commitment to the dissemination of surgical knowledge. She has lectured extensively around the world and received countless awards and honours. Professor Anderson has also published profusely and has served on the editorial boards of numerous scientific journals. She is currently the Associate Editor of the *Journal of the American College of Surgeons* and the *Journal of Paediatric Surgery*.

Professor Ching-Shui Huang



Professor Huang obtained his MD in 1971 from the National Taiwan University, School of Medicine and completed his residency at the National Taiwan University Hospital. In 1977, Professor Huang joined as a staff surgeon at the Departments of Surgery, Cathay General Hospital and the National Taiwan University Hospital. In 1988, Professor Huang completed his fellowship at the Department of Surgery, Cornell-New York Medical Center, New York, USA. In 1996, he became the Chairman, Department of

Surgery, Cathay General Hospital, followed in 2000, by the appointment as Vice-Superintendent of the Hospital. Currently he is also Clinical Professor of Surgery, School of Medicine, Taipei Medical University.

Professor Huang has expansive clinical and research interests in gastrointestinal surgery, endoscopic surgery, paediatric surgery and hernia surgery. He is one of the pioneers of laparoscopic surgery in Taiwan, having served there on numerous learned societies and associations. He is currently the President of the Surgical Society of Gastroenterology as well as the Chinese Association of Endoscopic Surgery in Taiwan. Professor Huang is also a member of many international societies and has served on the Executive Committee of the International Society for Digestive Surgery since 2004.

Besides being a reviewer of a number of scientific journals, Professor Huang is a member of the editorial board of the *Gastroenterological Journal of Taiwan* and the *New Taipei Medical Journal*. He has published numerous peer-reviewed articles, conference papers and book chapters.

Professor Thomas K Krummel



Professor Krummel graduated from the Medical College of Wisconsin, Milwaukee in 1977. He completed his general surgery residency at the Medical College of Virginia and his paediatric surgery residency at the Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh. Commencing his academic career in 1985 at the Division of Paediatric Surgery, Medical College of Virginia, Professor Krummel then became in 1989 the Chairman of the Division of Paediatric Surgery and Associate Professor of Surgery and Paediatrics. He subsequently moved to the Pennsylvania State University

College of Medicine in 1990 as Professor of Surgery and Paediatrics, later assuming the positions within that organisation of John A. and Marian T. Waldhausen Professor and Chair of the Department of Surgery, Surgeon-in-Chief of University Hospitals, and Director of the Section of Surgical Sciences. In 1998, Professor Krummel joined the Stanford University School of Medicine as the Emile Holman Professor and Chair of the Department of Surgery. Currently he is also the Susan B. Ford Surgeon-in-Chief of the Lucile Packard Children's Hospital and the Director of Surgical Innovation Program @ Stanford.

Professor Krummel has received numerous awards and honours, amongst which include the American College of Surgeons Fellowship and the James IV Travelling Fellowship. He has also served on many committees of various professional societies, including the American College of Surgeons, American Paediatric Surgical Association and American Surgical Association. Professor Krummel was the Director of the American Board of Surgery (1997-2003) and he is currently the Director of the James IV Association of Surgeons.

With his interests in cellular and biochemical mechanisms of fetal healing, simulation and virtual reality in surgical education and surgical innovation, Professor Krummel has published numerous peer reviewed articles, in addition to, abstracts, posters and book chapters. He also serves on the editorial board of *Contemporary Surgery* and has been guest editor of the *American Journal of Surgery* and *Operative Techniques in General Surgery*.

Professor Mark A Malangoni



Professor Malangoni graduated in 1975 from the Indiana University School of Medicine at Indianapolis. In 1980 after his surgical residency, Professor Malangoni joined the Medical College of Wisconsin at Milwaukee as Assistant Professor of Surgery and in 1984 was promoted to Associate Professor. In 1990, he moved to Cleveland, Ohio and was appointed as Professor of Surgery at the Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine. Currently he is also the Chair and Surgeon-in-Chief of the Department of

Surgery, MetroHealth Medical Center at Cleveland, Ohio.

Professor Malangoni is an active researcher with a variety of interests including trauma surgery, surgical critical care, surgical infection and medical education. Numerous honours and awards have been bestowed upon him for his teaching, research and service. Professor Malangoni has received many research grants and has been invited as visiting professor by many eminent institutions. Professor Malangoni is an active member of numerous professional societies; he is currently the Chairman of the Advisory Council for General Surgery and a member of the Executive Committee of the Board of Governors of the American College of Surgeons.

Professor Malangoni has served on the editorial boards of a number of prestigious surgical journals, including *Annals of Surgery*, *Surgical Infection* and *Surgery*. He has published numerous peer reviewed articles, book chapters and several other works of scholarship.

Professor Shu-You Peng



Professor Peng received his medical education at Zhejiang University in Hangzhou, where he graduated with first class honours. After his surgical training at the Second Affiliated Hospital of Zhejiang University, Professor Peng became Attending Surgeon and Lecturer of Surgery at the same institution, followed in 1981, with the appointment of Associate Professor. He then spent four years as visiting professor in the United Kingdom and Ireland, during which time he visited the Charing Cross Hospital in London, the Royal Victoria Hospital of Queens University in Belfast, and the Royal

Hallamshire Hospital in Sheffield, where he was an active researcher of acute pancreatitis, portal hypertension and colonic ischaemia. Professor Peng returned to Hangzhou in 1986 as Professor and Chairman of the Department of Surgery at the Second Affiliated Hospital. In 1994, he became Senior Consulting Surgeon to the newly established Sir Run Run Shaw Hospital in Hangzhou.

Professor Peng has broad research interests in basic science as well as clinical problems such as shock, haemorrhage, trauma, surgical nutrition, transplantation, and disorders of the alimentary system. His innovations include a variety of surgical instruments; eight of which have been patented. The most outstanding is the *Peng's Multifunction Operative Dissector (PMOD)*, which enables difficult operations to be performed easily and safely. Professor Peng has also pioneered a variety of surgical procedures. The most well known is the *Binding Pancreatico-jejunostomy*, which reduces the incidence of anastomotic leakage after pancreaticoduodenectomy.

Professor Peng has received numerous awards and prizes, amongst which include the 2001 State Technological Invention Award, the 2004 State Scientific and Technological Progress Award, and the Ho Leung Ho Lee Foundation Award, given to individuals who have achieved outstanding innovations or made extraordinary contributions in science or technology. In 2004 he was elected as an Honorary Fellow of the American College of Surgeons. His bibliography includes an extensive list of articles in Chinese and international medical journals, and numerous book chapters and books.

Professor Hiroshi Shimada



Professor Shimada graduated from the Yokohama City University School of Medicine in Yokohama, Japan having completed his surgical residency and fellowship at the same institution. In 1982, he became Assistant Professor at Fukui Medical School, Fukui, Japan and in 1989 was promoted to Associate Professor. In 1992, Professor Shimada was appointed Professor and Chairman, Department of Gastroenterological Surgery, Yokohama City University Graduate School of Medicine, Yokohama, Japan. In 2005, he became the Dean of the Yokohama City University School of Medicine.

Professor Shimada has extensive clinical and research experience in gastrointestinal surgery, and he is particularly interested in hepatic and upper gastrointestinal cancer. He was a Clinical and Research Fellow at Cambridge, England with Professor Calne and at Pittsburg, USA with Professor Starzl. He continues to serve on numerous local and international professional societies, and is currently a council member of the International Society for Digestive Surgery. Professor Shimada was the Congress President of 19th World Congress of the Society in 2004 and the Vice President of the Congress Organisation Committee of the International Association of Surgeons and Gastroenterologists, also in 2004.

Professor Shimada has lectured as a visiting professor in many parts of the world. He has published extensively on gastrointestinal surgery and authored numerous articles in peer reviewed journals. He currently serves on the editorial boards of a number of scientific journals, including *Liver Transplantation*, *World Journal of Gastroenterology*, *Langenbeck's Archives of Surgery* and *Digestive Surgery*.
