## Professor Tan Sri G B Ong

(1922 - 2004)



Professor Ong, affectionately known as "GB", graduated from the Medical School of The University of Hong Kong in 1947. He was appointed to the Chair of Surgery at The University of Hong Kong in 1964. He became an Emeritus Professor at The University of Hong Kong following his retirement in 1982 - a position which was bestowed on him till his passing away on 10 January 2004 after a courageous battle with cancer.

Professor Ong was recognised internationally for his contributions to surgery, particularly in the fields of esophageal cancer surgery, hepatobiliary surgery and surgical oncology. Throughout his career, Professor Ong was showered with richly merited honours and distinctions. His skills were recognised by a battery of authorities and agencies which clamoured for his expertise. As a recipient of the Hunterian Professorship, Moynihan Lectureship and the Sims Travelling Professorship to the Commonwealth, he travelled widely and delivered numerous eponymous lectures internationally.

He published over 250 papers on various aspects of general surgery, as well as having contributed to books and monographs. He was made member of nearly 30 medical societies. For his service to the community and professional achievements, he was made O.B.E. by Her Majesty the Queen; and "Tan Sri" by His Majesty the King of Malaysia.

Numerous obituaries published in his honour in both medical and non-medical media are testimony to his prominent place in global surgical fraternity. His legendary stamina and determination as a master surgeon, teacher and a visionary will always be remembered.

## G B Ong Visiting Professor

## Professor Henri Bismuth



Professor Bismuth graduated from the Université de Paris, France in 1963. He completed his Surgical Residency at the Department of Surgery of Hospital Bichat in Paris. In 1977, he was appointed as the Head & Chief of Service of the Department of Surgery at Hospital Paul Brousse, Villejuif, and in 1978, Professor of Surgery and Head of the Department of Experimental Surgery at the Faculty of Medicine Kremlin Bicêtre, Paris South University.

In 1993 Professor Bismuth established the world-renowned Henri Bismuth Hepatobiliary Institute at the Hospital Paul Brousse in Villejuif. The Institute is dedicated to the provision of global care for patients with bile duct and liver disorders, and is the first transplant centre in France and among the first within Europe. Since 2005, Professor Bismuth has been Director of the Henri Bismuth Hepatobiliary Institute, Honorary Consultant of the Hospital Paul Brousse, and Professor Emeritus of Surgery at the Paris South University.

A member of numerous surgical organisations, Professor Bismuth has held leadership positions in many professional societies, including Academie Nationale de Chirurgie, Honorary Member of the American College of Surgeons, American Surgical Association, Royal College of Surgeons of Ireland, Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, Association of Surgeons of Great Britain and Ireland, Asian Surgical Association, and Society for Surgery of Alimentary Tract. He has been honoured with *Doctor Honoris Causa* from numerous institutions, citing briefly the universities of Turin, Porto, Coimbra, and Warsaw, as well as having received the *Cavalieri della Gran Croce* from Italy.

Professor Bismuth has devoted his career to hepatobiliary surgery and has published extensively in internationally peer reviewed journals. He has served on the editorial boards of a significant number of journals, including the *Annals of Surgery, American Journal of Surgery, Clinical Transplantation, Hepato-Gastroenterology, Transplant International, European Journal of Surgical Oncology,* and *Annales de Chirurgie.* 

# **Professor Kirby Bland**



Professor Bland graduated from the University of Alabama Medical College, United States in 1968. He completed his General Surgery Residency and Fellowship in Immunology at the University of Florida College of Medicine, as well as a Surgical Oncology Fellowship at the MD Anderson Cancer Center at the University of Texas. In 1983, he became Professor and Associate Chairman of the Department of Surgery at the University of Florida College of Medicine, and in 1993, he was appointed as J. Murray Beardsley Professor and Chairman of the Department of Surgery at Brown University School of Medicine. In 1999, he

returned to his alma mater as the Fay Fletcher Kerner Professor and Chairman and Surgeon-in-Chief of the Department of Surgery at the University of Alabama at Birmingham and Kirklin Clinic.

Professor Bland has received numerous awards and honours, and he has also served on many committees of various professional societies. At present he chairs the committee of the American College of Surgeons Oncology Trials Group. He was a former Director of the American Board of Colon and Rectal Surgery and the American Board of Surgery. He is on the ACS Board of Governors, is President of the Southern Surgical Association, and a member of the Scientific Advisory Board of the National Cancer Institute.

Professor Bland's career has focused on surgical oncology including laboratory research and clinical trials. At Brown University he established a nationally recognised Department of Surgery that was research- and clinically- focused with National Institute of Health funding to be the top 15th percentile nationally. He is principal investigator of numerous research projects, many of which were funded by multiple institutional and pharmaceutical grants. His current emphasis is on breast cancer. Professor Bland is principal investigator of the National Institute of Health / National Cancer Institute Breast SPORE grant. He is a nationally recognised teacher of surgical sciences and has mentored multiple academic surgeons internationally. He is currently an active Editorial Board member of 12 journals, and the Editor of *The American Journal of Surgery*. He has published extensively with his bibliography including over 500 publications.

## Professor Pierre-Alain Clavien



Professor Clavien graduated from the Geneva Medical School, Switzerland in 1982. He completed his General Surgery Residency at the University Hospital of Basel and University Hospital of Geneva in 1988. He received his Fellowship training in transplantation at the Toronto General Hospital for Sick Children in 1993. He became the Chief of Hepatobiliary Surgery in the Department of Thoracic and General Surgery at Duke University in 1996, followed by Director of the Division of

Transplantation at the same institution in 1997 and promoted as Professor in 1999. In 2000, he returned to Switzerland and is currently Professor and Chairman of the Department of Visceral and Transplant Surgery at the University Hospital of Zurich.

Professor Clavien has served on over 40 national and international committees of professional societies, including the International Hepato-Pancreato-Biliary Association, International Surgical Group, The British Journal of Surgery Society, and the Council of the National Institute of Research of Switzerland. He is the Secretary General of both the European Surgical Association and the European section of the International Hepato-Pancreato-Biliary Association.

Professor Clavien's main research interest is on hepatobiliary surgery, having published over 200 journal articles. He has secured many major competitive grants, including grants from the National Institute of Health and the Swiss National Funds. He has been the Associate Editor to *Liver Transplantation and Surgery, Journal of Hepatology, Annals of Surgery, and the American Journal of Transplantation*.

## **Professor Antonio Lacy**



Professor Lacy graduated from the University of Barcelona, Spain in 1980 and obtained his Ph.D., Magna Cum Laude, during his residency training at the same university. He was appointed as Associate Professor of Surgery from 1998 to 2003, and became Titular Professor and Chief Staff in 2003. Currently he is Chief of Section of both Minimally Invasive Surgery, and of Colorectal Surgery, in the Department of Gastroenterological Surgery at the Hospital Clinic de Barcelona.

Professor Lacy is an active member of many professional societies. He is the Vice President of the European Association for Endoscopic Surgery (EAES), and served as the Congress President of the same society in 2004. Other memberships include the Catalan Society of Surgery, International Society of Surgery, European Association of Coloproctology, and the Society of Gastrointestinal Endoscopic Surgeons.

The main focus of Professor Lacy's research is on laparoscopic colorectal surgery. He has published extensively in prestigious journals, such as *Lancet Oncology, Annals of Surgery*, and *Journal of Clinical Oncology*. He serves on the editorial board of "*Ippocrate*", and acts as a regular reviewer of many other journals.

## Professor Takeshi Sano



Professor Sano graduated in 1980 from the University of Tokyo, and completed his training at the First Department of Surgery, University of Tokyo. He spent 15 months in Paris between 1986 and 1987 as a research fellow of the French Government Scholarship at Institute Curie. He was awarded a doctorate in Medical Science in 1993 through his experimental research on gastric carcinogenesis. He joined the Gastric Surgery Division at the National Cancer Center Hospital in the same year, and was appointed as the Head of the Division in 1996.

Professor Sano is an active researcher with his major interest in surgery of the stomach, especially gastric cancer. He has served on numerous committees of professional societies. He is a Council and Secretary Member of the Japanese Gastric Cancer Association, a Secretary Member of the International Gastric Cancer Association, and an honorary member of the Chilean Surgical Society. As a steering committee member of the Japan Clinical Oncology Group he has played a central role in multi-institutional clinical trials on gastric cancer surgery.

Professor Sano has extensive research and clinical experience in gastrointestinal surgery. He has taught many surgeons outside Japan the technique of gastric surgery, serving as the Coordinator in the United Kingdom-Japan exchange teaching program in GI cancer, and Faculty in D2 Gastrectomy Course of the Royal College of Surgeons in England. He has performed live demonstrations on gastrectomy in many countries, including the United Kingdom, Italy, Brazil, Peru, Ecuador, Hong Kong, India, Taiwan, Singapore and Vietnam. He serves on the Editorial board on many journals, such as Japanese Journal of Clinical Oncology, Gastric Cancer, and Asia Pacific Journal of Clinical Oncology.
